PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The \$67 million dollar project is a design-bid-build delivery of utility and communication infrastructure on the Marine Corps Air Station, Yuma, Arizona. The project will be completed in 13 months.

The project will provide a stormwater collection system, including retention basins, on-site percolation systems, drainage swales, drop inlets, box culverts, and pipelines to support new hangar facilities. New natural gas pipe systems will be constructed.

AN existing water storage tank will be removed and two new 750,000-gallon potable water storage tanks constructed. A new potable water distribution line from the new tanks will serve the hangar facilities. Existing sewer collection systems will be relocated and upgraded. Construction includes running new gravity and force main lines from new facilities to existing lines. Two new sanitary sewer lift stations will be constructed.

The project will construct a new electrical distribution system and 69kV substation for power supplied by Arizona Public Service (APS). The new switch station will feed existing circuits and provide a new circuit for the JSF facilities. This contract will include construction of one single story Communications Building, and communications outside plant fiber and copper infrastructure throughout the base.

Project includes the following scopes of work but not limited to:

- Installation gage metal framing, drywall
- Tile, flooring and painting
- Painting
- Bathroom partitions and accessories

The selection of subcontractors will be based upon qualifications, technical proposal, proposal price, delivery schedule, and safety experience. It is understood that the subcontract may be awarded to a firm or team that has not submitted the lowest proposal price. It is strongly encouraged bidders complete **dck's** Prequalification Form prior to bidding.

Payment and Performance bonds a required for successful bidders for the full amount of the bid.

Contracted bidders are required to have all employees with site access complete and pass a background investigation conducted by the Department of Homeland Security – Federal Protective Service (DHS-FPS) prior to the start of work.

All bidders must comply with the corresponding NAVFAC security policies prior to release of bid documents.

There are established Small Business goals for this project. **dck** has committed to assuring that Small, Hubzone, Small Disadvantaged, Women-Owned, Veteran-Owned, and Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business concerns are provided the maximum practicable opportunity to participate as subcontractors in accordance with the proficient contract performance. **dck** is dedicated to a Good Faith Effort to meet the goals for minority and female participation. Contracted bidders will be required to adopt and comply with **dck's** small business goals.
